Stay Safe, Be SMART Safer Internet Week at Abuja Preparatory School

This week we are observing Safer Internet Week at Abuja Prep. This coincides with Safer Internet Day on Tuesday 5th February.

The internet is a brilliant platform for children to learn and have fun and within our learning at Abuja Prep and we encourage our children to use it regularly and build on their skills.

There are risks online, just like in the real world; therefore, it is important to understand what children are doing online so that you can guide them. Taking risks is a normal part of growing up, but in the online world, this can have long-term effects that can cause distress to children and their families. It is important to create a balance between allowing your child to experiment and develop their independence, and making sure they are aware of what can go wrong and how to manage it.

This week also promotes the important role that parents and other responsible adults in the community play. We would like to encourage our parents to have a conversation with the aim of keeping our children and young people safe when online. We will also be discussing this with both KS1 and KS2 children and then each class will do a focused activity based on the theme create, connect and share respect.

There are a few parents who have not yet met their obligations to us. We would like to request that all outstanding fees be paid by Friday 8th Feb 2019. Thank you.








Frozen Yogurt Day
